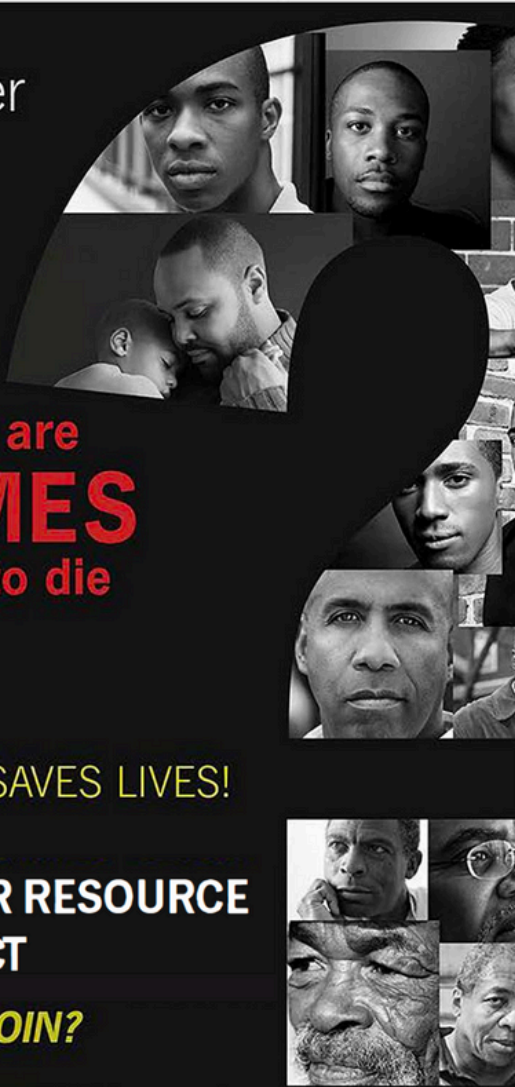

Prostate cancer is the most common male cancer and a leading health disparity.

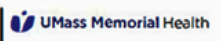

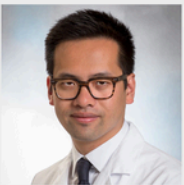
